Your RYA Course

All RYA courses follow the syllabus detailed in the RYA G158/15 logbook. The format of each course is dependent upon weather, wind, tide and experience of the crew.

The yacht you will be sailing is fully equipped to RYA/MCA regulations and carries a full safety equipment inventory. First aid kits and VHF radios are also carried on board allowing rapid contact with medical authorities. Please ensure you complete the health declaration on your booking details. You must also inform the Universal Sailing School office of any medical conditions or medication you are taking, so this information can be passed to your Instructor.

What to Bring

It is essential that you bring enough suitable clothing to suit varied weather conditions.

Please pack your clothing in a soft holdall as suitcases cannot be stored on board.

Below is a suggested list for what to bring on board:-

- **Pillows / sleeping bag or duvet & mattress sheet**
- Footwear – Soft soled trainers or deck shoes
- Sailing Boots (or 2nd pair of soft soled shoes)
- Wet weather gear – bring your own or available to borrow on request (limited supply)
- Clothing - a selection of layers to suit weather conditions (preferably no jeans)
- Several changes of clothes / underwear
- Clothing for going ashore
- Passport size photo (Day Skipper / Coastal Skipper only)
- Towel
- Wash kit
- Thick socks (at least 2 pairs)
- Hat & Gloves note: if windy hats may tend to disappear overboard!
- Sun cream & sun block (if necessary)
- Sunglasses (with spec saver)
- Money to cover food, drinks, etc.

Waterproofs

We have a selection of adult waterproofs sizes (jackets & salopettes) available if you do not have your own. Please give details of size(s) required on your booking form if you wish to hire waterproofs. £25 per set for the duration of the course. Unfortunately we do not hire sailing boots for hygiene reasons. We have a limited number of child sizes.

Lifejackets for children - We recommend children have lifejackets fitted a child's correct size/weight.

We have 3 junior self inflating lifejackets available on request. They are for children weighing 25-60 Kg.

Younger children are better to have a buoyancy aid style which can be purchased from an online chandlery

Log Books - Sail Cruising & Yachtmaster Scheme G158/15

Please bring along your log book. If you require a log book, please indicate this on your booking form or advise us in advance so we can make sure your Instructor has it on board for you.

RYA Certificates

Students who pass will be issued with an RYA certificate at the end of the course. For Day Skipper & Coastal Skipper, please provide your skipper with a passport sized photograph, YM Coastal & Offshore Exam candidates will require 2 passport photos, log book, VHF Certificate, First Aid Certificate & completed exam form.

All our yachts are fully insured against accident, third party liability and personal injury arising from neglect by Universal Sailing School. We accept no liability for personal accident or loss or damage to the property of the client.

Accommodation Onboard

The saloon area is classed as a sleeping area and exact sleeping arrangements are worked out with the instructor at the start of your course depending on the mix of crew.

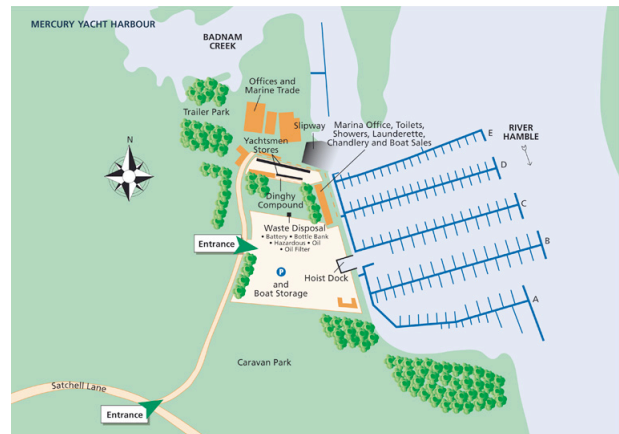

Originally built by Sir Robin Knox Johnston, Mercury Yacht Harbour is situated in a sheltered wooded site where the shallow waters of Badnam Creek join the River Hamble. Just a 20 minute walk from Hamble village.

Local Village - Hamble

Hamble le Rice has a small Co-op with cashpoint, and some small shops including a deli. NatWest and Barclays Banks have a presence here too.

Eating in Hamble (not all open currently due to Coronavirus restrictions)

Hamble has plenty of bars and restaurants including a fish and chip shop and an Indian restaurant. Pubs include The Bugle, The King and Queen (which has a launderette available for visiting yachtsman), The White Hart and the Victory Inn. Restaurants in the marinas are Gaff Rigger at Mercury Yacht Harbour, Banana Wharf at Port Hamble and Ketch Rigger at Hamble Point Marina.

Main Provisioning

There is a large Tesco's supermarket about a mile away by car, which you pass on your way to Hamble, just off the junction 8 exit of the M27. Currently there are large queues due to the Coronavirus restrictions, so would recommend you shop in advance and bring your provisioning with you.

How to find us:

By Road For Sat Navs, postcode is SO31 4HQ.

Hamble, also known as Hamble-le-Rice, lies off the A27 on the East side of Southampton Water, between the cities of Southampton and Portsmouth. There is a large free car park at Mercury Yacht Harbour.

Directions - Leave the M27 at junction 8 signposted Hamble/Southampton East. This will take you to a roundabout – from the East take the first exit, from the West take the third exit. At the next roundabout take the second exit. There will be a Tesco store on your left. Go straight across the next two mini roundabouts and the traffic lights. Follow this road for approximately 3/4 mile. Go straight across the next roundabout and then immediately left into Satchell Lane. Follow this road over the bridge and eventually you will see the sign for Mercury Yacht Harbour on your left where there is a free car park.
